Supporting the *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over 2016 Statewide Crackdown*

Whereas, approximately one-third of all fatal traffic crashes in the United States involve drunk drivers; and

Whereas, impaired driving crashes cost the United States almost \$50 Billion a year; and

Whereas, 27% of motor vehicle fatalities in New Jersey in 2013 (the last year for which complete data is available) were alcohol-related; and

Whereas, an enforcement crackdown is planned to combat impaired driving; and

Whereas, the summer season and the Labor Day holiday in particular are traditionally times of social gatherings which include alcohol; and

Whereas, the State of New Jersey, Division of Highway Traffic Safety, has asked law enforcement agencies throughout the state to participate in the *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over 2016 Statewide Crackdown*; and

Whereas, the project will involve increased impaired driving enforcement from August 19 through September 5, 2016; and

Whereas, an increase in impaired driving enforcement and a reduction in impaired driving will save lives on our roadways;

Therefore, be it resolved that the City of Burlington hereby declares its support for the *Drive Sober or Get Pulled Over 2016 Statewide Crackdown* from August 19 through September 5, 2016 and pledges to increase awareness of the dangers of drinking and driving.

RESOLUTION NO. 174-2017 OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BURLINGTON EXPRESSING ITS ENDORSEMENT IN SUPPORT OF THE STATE OF NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION ROUTE 130/COLUMBUS ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Burlington has listened to the presentations of the State of NJ Department of Transportation (NJDOT) concerning the Route 130 traffic corridor in the general area and vicinity of Columbus Road; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Burlington in listening to the NJDOT's plans, has expressed various opinions and concerns to the NJDOT; and

WHEREAS, the NJDOT has listened to these plans, worked with the Common Council and residents of the City of Burlington in coming up with a plan that best suits the needs of the residents of the City of Burlington; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council hereby finds that the traffic pattern as envisioned and improved upon by the NJDOT will improve the traffic pattern in the Route 130 corridor in the vicinity of Columbus Road;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Burlington as follows:

1. The Common Council hereby authorizes and directs the City Clerk to forward a letter to the NJDOT indicating its support for the Route 130 corridor plan as presented to the Common Council on June 20, 2017.
2. The City Clerk is further directed to forward such a letter to be attached to this Resolution expressing its support for this plan.

A Resolution of the Common Council of the City of Burlington authorizing the execution of an Addendum to the Agreement for the provision of energy supply between the City of Burlington and the County of Burlington.

Whereas, the City of Burlington entered into an Agreement for the provision of electricity generation supply services for residential government energy aggregation on or about June 14, 2016; and

Whereas, pursuant to the Agreement the City and the County have the option to renew the agreement by consent under certain conditions if met; and

Whereas, said provisions require that any renewal must provide a guarantee for savings as it relates to pricing for the renewal term so as to ensures savings to residential residents for the City of Burlington; and

Whereas, the Common Council of the City of Burlington has reviewed the Agreement, and is satisfied that at a minimum the residents of the City of Burlington will receive a minimum savings of three percent (3 percent) savings in the energy supply portion of the residents energy bill; and

Whereas, the Common Council finds that such an agreement renewal is in the best interests of the citizens of the City of Burlington;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by be Common Council for the City of Burlington as follows:

1. The Mayor and Municipal Clerk are authorized and directed to execute the Addendum to the Agreement between the City of Burlington and the County of Burlington for energy supply to the residents of the City of Burlington, in the

form as supplied by the County of Burlington and reviewed by the City Director of Law.
