#### **NEIGHBORHOOD LITTER CLEAN-UP WEEK IS April 29 to May 6th**

City residents will have the use of free litter dumpsters for the disposal of neighborhood litter and outdoor residential yard wastes. No construction debris or hazardous wastes will be accepted. All brush must be bundled and branches longer than 8 feet will not be accepted. **Dumpsters will be located at the Municipal Recycling Drop-Off Center at 850 Jacksonville Rd. (across from Laurel Hill Cemetery).** The Center will be open this week (Monday through Friday) from 8:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. and on Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 2:30 p.m. Anyone leaving litter or materials outside of the fenced area when the Center is closed will be subject to a \$1,000 illegal dumping fine.
