ORDINANCE NO. _____-2024 OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BURLINGTON AMENDING, SUPPLEMENTING, AND REVISING CHAPTER 300 OF THE CITY OF BURLINGTON CODE, ENTITLED "COLLECTION OF WASTE MATERIAL"

WHEREAS, the City of Burlington (the "City") is a Faulkner Act municipality with a Mayor-Council form of government pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:69A-31, *et seq.*, with its organization, positions, powers and duties outlined within the Code of the City of Burlington as set forth pursuant to the Faulkner Act; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 300, Article I of the City Code sets forth rules and regulations concerning waste collection within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to revise Chapter 300, Article I of the City Code to reflect updated procedures, fees, and materials; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:48-2, the Common Council is authorized to enact and amend ordinances as deemed necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and as may be necessary to carry into effect the powers and duties conferred and imposed upon the City by law.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council for the City of Burlington, in the County of Burlington, State of New Jersey that the Code of the City of Burlington is hereby amended, revised and/or supplemented as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 300, Section 3, "Containers or receptacles" is hereby amended, supplemented, and revised as follows:

§ 300-3 Containers or receptacles.

- A. All solid waste is to be placed into City-issued, ninety-six-gallon containers. City-issued solid waste containers are the property of the City. City Public Works will also exchange a ninety-five-gallon container for a forty-five-gallon container upon the request of a resident. The City will provide each Residential User with one (1) ninety-six-gallon container. Each residential dwelling with more than two units will be provided with a single additional ninety-six-gallon container per two additional units (i.e., residential dwellings with three to four units will receive two containers).
- B. Additional containers can be obtained (for a fee) on the City's website.
- C. Contents placed into the container should not exceed the maximum rating of 250 pounds. It is the responsibility of the resident to maintain the container in a clean, sanitary, and overall safe manner. Additionally, it is the resident's sole responsibility to alert the City of damage to the container that prohibits the ability for it to be effectively utilized for disposal and collection, and theft of a container. If the container is damaged during trash collection, the cart will be replaced at no cost to the resident upon reporting to Public Works.

D. Upon an event of theft, a police report shall be filed, and Public Works shall be provided with a copy of the report. Upon submission of the police report, the property will be issued another container. Payment for the replacement container (ninety-five or forty-five gallon) will be processed at the Public Works Office via check or money order payable to the City of Burlington.

SECTION 2: Chapter 300, Section 6 "Bulk items" is hereby amended, supplemented, and revised as follows:

§ 300-6 Bulk items.

- A. All household rubbish, except for bulk items, shall be placed in City-issued trash carts. Bulk items include, but are not limited to, sofas, chairs, regular wood furniture (not pressure treated), bagged mattresses and boxsprings, and other small non-metal items. Material shall be free of protruding nails, screws, staples or other dangerous conditions. Bulk items does not include, construction debris, appliances, household bagged trash, metal items, electronic equipment, computers, televisions, printers, etc. Appliances such as refrigerators, freezers, and air condition units that contain freon must be taken to the Burlington County Resource Recovery Complex.
- B. Mattresses left for bulk collection must be covered in a plastic mattress disposal bag before being placed at the curb and must be left for collection in a manner which does not obstruct any public right of ways.
- C. Bulk items, as defined above, that do not fit into the ninety-six-gallon trash container will be collected twice per month, on alternate weeks as designated by the Director of Public Works. The Trash and Bulk Information shall be accessible on the City website. A maximum of two items per household will be collected, unless otherwise set forth by the Director of the Department of Public Work. Residents are required to call the City Public Works Department to schedule their bulk pick up no later than noon on the Wednesday prior to the scheduled pick-up date. The items are to be placed out to the curb the night before pick-up and not earlier unless specific arrangements are made with Public Works.

SECTION 3: Except as set forth in Sections 1 and 2, the balance of the Code of the City of Burlington shall not be affected by this Ordinance.

SECTION 4: All Ordinances contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent they are inconsistent herewith.

SECTION 5: If the provisions of any section, subsection, paragraph, subdivision or clause of this Ordinance shall be judged invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such order of judgment shall not affect or invalidate the remainder of any section, subsection, paragraph or subdivision, or clause of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6: This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after final passage by Council or twenty (20) days after approval by the Mayor, whichever comes first.

ORDINANCE NO. 28-2024

ORDINANCE AMENDING BOND ORDINANCE 06-2022 OF THE CITY OF BURLINGTON, COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, the City of Burlington, County of Burlington, New Jersey ("City") has heretofore duly and finally adopted Bond Ordinance 06-2022, authorizing supplemental funding for the construction of a bandstand for the City ("Bond Ordinance"); and

WHEREAS, the City desires to amend the purpose of the Bond Ordinance by amending Section 7(A) thereof.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the City Council of the City of Burlington, County of Burlington, New Jersey (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring), pursuant to the provisions of the Local Bond Law, Chapter 169 of the Laws of 1960 of the State of New Jersey, as amended and supplemented ("Local Bond Law"), as follows:

Section 1. Section 7(A) of the Bond Ordinance is hereby amended to provide as follows:

	"Purpose/Improvement	Estimated Total Cost	Down Payment	Amount of Obligations	Period of <u>Usefulness</u>
A.	Rehabilitation and Reconstruction of the Historical William R. Allen School, together with the acquisition of all materials and equipment and completion of all work necessary therefor or related thereto"	\$1,500,000	\$75,000	\$1,425,000	20 years

- Section 2. The capital budget is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency therewith and the regulations promulgated by the Local Finance Board showing full detail the amended capital budget and capital improvement program as approved by the Director of the Division of Local Government Services, New Jersey Department of Community Affairs, are on file with the Clerk and available for public inspection.
- Section 3. All other parts of the Bond Ordinance not amended hereby shall remain in full force and effect.
- Section 4. In accordance with the Local Bond Law, this ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

ORDINANCE NO. 30-2024 OF THE CITY OF BURLINGTON AMENDING, SUPPLEMENTING, AND REVISING CHAPTER 306 OF THE CITY OF BURLINGTON CODE, ENTITLED "STREETS AND SIDEWALKS"

WHEREAS, the City of Burlington (the "City") is a Faulkner Act municipality with a Mayor-Council form of government pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:69A-31, et seq., with its organization, positions, powers and duties outlined within the Code of the City of Burlington as set forth pursuant to the Faulkner Act; and

WHEREAS, Chapter 306, Article III of the City Code sets forth rules and regulations concerning excavations within the City; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to revise Chapter 306, Article III of the City Code to include additional provisions regarding moratoriums following the paving or repaving of a street and restoration of all areas outside of any asphalt opening; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:48-2, the Common Council is authorized to enact and amend ordinances as deemed necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and as may be necessary to carry into effect the powers and duties conferred and imposed upon the City by law.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Common Council for the City of Burlington, in the County of Burlington, State of New Jersey that the Code of the City of Burlington is hereby amended, revised and/or supplemented as follows:

SECTION 1: Chapter 306, Section 13, "Application information required" is hereby renamed to "Application for permit" and amended, supplemented, and revised as follows:

§ 306-13 Application for permit.

- A. [No Changes]

- C. In cases where the proposed opening involves construction of a longitudinal pipe main serving more than one property, the City may also require the applicant to submit plans showing the information required above and the relationship of the proposed installation to the existing pavement, other utilities, the street right-of-way lines, and any other physical feature which might be affected by the proposed construction.
- D. No permits shall be issued for a period of five (5) years where a pavement has been reconstructed or resurfaced, unless there is a need shown as a result of an emergency or hardship. The City shall maintain a map, available for public viewing, of all pavements currently under moratorium.

- 1. Where a hardship is demonstrated, the City Administrator, or their designee, shall have the authority to authorize the granting of a permit subject to the conditions as the City sees reasonable, such as special road restoration measures.
- 2. In the event of any emergency in which an underground utility of any kind or description in or under any street breaks, bursts or otherwise is in such conditions as to immediately endanger property, life, health or the public safety, the person owning or controlling such utility shall obtain the verbal approval of the City before taking emergency measures to cure or remedy the dangerous condition. The person owning or controlling the utility shall apply for an excavation permit, as provided herein, on the first business day on which the City Clerk's office is open for business after the occurrence of the emergency. Permanent repairs shall not be made until an excavation permit has been obtained.
- 3. In the event that emergency excavation of any road, street, avenue, or highway of the City or any portion of the right-of-way is required within the five-year period following paving or repaving of such, special restoration of the roadway may be required, including but not limited to full depth milling and overlay of the road as determined by the City Engineer.
- 4. An additional fee of one and a half times the regular fee amount will be required to be paid in addition to the standard application fee for the emergency excavation of any road, street, avenue, or highway of the City, or any portion of the right-of-way.

SECTION 2: Chapter 306, Section 16, "Standards" is hereby amended, supplemented, and revised as follows:

 - 2. Concrete Curbs. No curb shall be constructed or reconstructed in the City of Burlington unless said curb is constructed of concrete that is no less than 18 inches deep, eight (8) inches at the base, and six (6) inches at the top and have a compressive strength of 4,000 pounds per square inch after 28 days.
 - 3. Sidewalks. Sidewalks disturbed or damaged by any excavation or street opening must be restored to match the existing sidewalk in terms of material, color, texture, and overall appearance. All sidewalks shall be at least four (4) feet in width. All newly constructed sidewalks shall meet all requirements for accessibility pursuant to applicable law. Where the existing sidewalk is concrete, the restoration shall utilize concrete with a minimum compressive strength of 4,000 pounds per square inch after 28 days. When existing sidewalk is brick, the restoration shall utilize brick sidewalk pavers that match the existing terms specified above, constructed in a way suitable to the City Engineer.

- 4. Driveway aprons. Driveway aprons disturbed or damaged by any excavation or street opening must be restored. All driveway aprons shall be at least six (6) inches thick with welded wire fabric installed and utilize concrete with a compressive strength of 4,000 pounds per square inch after 28 days.
- 5. All lawns shall be restored with topsoil and seed to a depth of four (4) inches.
- 6. All other restorations require the review and approval of the City Engineer.
- 7. All restorations shall be completed within 30 days following the completion of the excavation and street opening work.

RE: Suggested Revisions to City's Code Regarding Street Excavations City of Burlington

Bill Curry, Director of Public Works City of Burlington 525 High Street Burlington City, NJ 08016

Dear Bill:

Based on our recent conversations regarding the City's Code as it relates to Road Opening Permits, we understand that the City may be interested in modifying this section of the Code. In particular, the City may wish to incorporate a moratorium on road openings for a particular time period following the paving or repaving of a street to protect the City's investment in the Road Program as well as include language pertaining to the restoration of all areas (curb, sidewalk, etc.) within City right-of-way (ROW). While we had also discussed possible modifications to the City's permit fee structure for road openings, after reviewing Chapter 146 of the City's Code, we found the existing language to be sufficient. Section 146-25 allows the City to require an escrow amount or additional permit fees for any road opening larger than four feet by four feet.

Regarding the inclusion of a moratorium following the paving or repaving of a street, the current requirements for Street Excavations are defined in Chapter 306, Article III of the City's Code. Currently, there is no restriction in the Code limiting Street Excavation following the paving or repaving of a street. In addition, the existing Code does not require utility companies to repair the full length of pavement after excavating multiple pits to install a new utility line. To address these issues, we would recommend changing the title of Section 306-13 of the City's Code to "Application for Permit" and adding the following language:

- C. In cases where the proposed opening involves construction of a longitudinal pipe main serving more than one property, the City may also require the applicant to submit plans showing the information required above and the relationship of the proposed installation to the existing pavement, other utilities, the street right-of-way lines, and any other physical feature which might be affected by the proposed construction.
- D. No permit shall be issued for a period of five (5) years where a pavement has been reconstructed or resurfaced, unless there is a need shown as a result of an emergency or hardship. The City shall maintain a map, available for public viewing, of all pavements currently under moratorium.

- 1) Where a hardship is demonstrated, the City Administrator, or their designee, shall have the authority to authorize the granting of a permit subject to conditions as the City sees reasonable, such as special road restoration measures.
- 2) In the event of any emergency in which an underground utility of any kind or description in or under any street breaks, bursts or otherwise is in such conditions as to immediately endanger property, life, health or the public safety, the person owning or controlling such utility shall obtain the verbal approval of the City before taking emergency measures to cure or remedy the dangerous condition. The person owning or controlling the utility shall apply for an excavation permit, as provided herein, on the first business day on which the City Clerk's office is open for business after the occurrence of the emergency. Permanent repairs shall not be made until an excavation permit has been obtained.
- 3) In the event that emergency excavation of any road, street, avenue, or highway of the City or any portion of the right-of-way is required within the five-year period following paving or repaving of such, special restoration of the roadway may be required, including but not limited to full depth milling and overlay of the road as determined by the City Engineer.
- 4) An additional fee of one and half times the regular fee amount will be required to be paid in addition to the standard application fee for the emergency excavation of any road, street, avenue, or highway of the City, or any portion of the right-of-way.

Secondly, regarding the inclusion of specific language for restoration of all areas outside of any asphalt opening, the current requirements are defined in 306-16 Standards, subsection B. Asphalt paving restoration has specific specifications listed under subsection (1) while all other (i.e. non-asphalt restorations) are covered briefly under subsection (2). As such, we would recommend revising subsection (2) onward to the following:

- (2) Concrete Curbs. No curb shall be constructed or reconstructed in the City of Burlington unless said curb is constructed of concrete that is no less than 18 inches deep, eight inches at the base, and six inches at the top and have a compressive strength of 4,000 pounds per square inch after 28 days.
- (3) Sidewalks. Sidewalks disturbed or damaged by any excavation or street opening must be restored to match the existing sidewalk in terms of material, color, texture, and overall appearance. All sidewalks shall be at least four feet in width. All newly constructed or reconstructed sidewalks shall meet all requirements for accessibility pursuant to applicable law. Where the existing sidewalk is concrete, the restoration shall utilize concrete with a minimum compressive strength of 4,000 pounds per square inch after 28 days. When existing sidewalk is brick, the restoration shall utilize brick sidewalk pavers that match the existing terms specified above, constructed in a way suitable to the City Engineer.
- (4) Driveway aprons. Driveway aprons disturbed or damaged by any excavation or street opening must be restored. All driveway aprons shall be at least six inches thick with welded wire fabric installed and utilize concrete with a compressive strength of 4,000 pounds per square inch after 28 days.
- (5) All lawns shall be restored with topsoil and seed to a depth of four inches.
- (6) All other restorations require the review and approval of the City Engineer.

(7) All restorations shall be completed within 30 days following the completion of the excavation and street opening work.

ORDINANCE NO. 31-2024 OF THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BURLINGTON AUTHORIZING THE PUBLIC SALE OF CERTAIN BURLINGTON CITY OWNED PROPERTIES PURSUANT TO N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13(a)

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 40A:12-13(a) authorizes the public sale of real property no longer needed for public use; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Burlington has determined that certain parcels of municipally owned lands are not necessary for public use, said lands being identified on Schedule "A" attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, the Common Council of the City of Burlington has determined that said properties would be of better value as a privately owned tax ratable.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED the Common Council of the City of Burlington, County of Burlington and State of New Jersey that:

SECTION 2. Notice of said public land sale shall be published in a newspaper circulating in the municipality by two (2) insertions during two (2) consecutive weeks, the last publication to be not earlier than seven (7) days prior to the public land sale. A Notice of Public Land Sale shall also be posted on the Burlington City bulletin board and website.

SECTION 3. The City Solicitor and City Administrator shall conduct the public sale.

SECTION 4. A. The City shall accept bids by public auction of the properties being offered for sale with the bid being awarded to the highest bidder above the minimum sale price set forth on Schedule "A".

B. Said properties are being offered for sale with the condition that Burlington City is issuing no representations or warranties as to the permissibility or advisability of the property's use or of any limiting environmental conditions. The successful bidder is solely

responsible for obtaining any and all necessary Local, County or State Permits and/or Approvals for use of the properties or for constructing any improvement on the properties.

- C. All bids shall be referred to the Common Council of the City of Burlington for review and final approval which shall be by Resolution within fourteen (14) days after bids are received.
- **D**. Burlington City reserves the right at any time prior to confirmation of the sale by the Common Council of the City of Burlington to reject any and all bids.
- E. The successful bidder shall be required to pay all conveyancing expenses, including legal fees, deed preparation fees and advertising costs, and to provide at its own expense a title search and legal description to Burlington City for the preparation of the Deed of Conveyance by Burlington City.
- **F.** The minimum purchase price for each lot and all other conditions of sale are described in Schedule "A" attached hereto and as may be advertised or announced at the public land sale.
- **G.** A Bargain and Sale Deed will be the document of conveyance and no warranties or representations as to title are made by Burlington City. If, however, Burlington City is unable to convey marketable title, any deposit monies received pursuant to this bidding procedure will be returned.
- H. The confirmation of the sale by the Common Council of the City of Burlington shall be an acceptance of the bid and, thereafter, within thirty (30) days from said confirmation, settlement must be completed by the successful bidder. PROPOSED PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT

2024 Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Environmental Record Review (ERR)

THIS AGREEMENT made by and between the City of Burlington, with principal offices located at 525 High Street, Burlington, New Jersey, hereinafter referred to as "the City" and CGP&H, LLC, with principal offices located at 1249 South River Road, Suite 301, Cranbury, New Jersey, hereinafter referred to as "CGP&H."

WHEREAS, the City wishes to engage CGP&H to assist in the preparation of an ERR to be submitted to HUD through their online HEROS portal consistent with the rules and regulations of that program, and in administering such project the following shall apply:

I. CONSULTANT SCOPE OF SERVICES

- A. Preparation of ERR for electronic submission to HUD by the deadline to comply with terms of the federal CPF Grant Agreement as set forth within that document.
- B. Coordinate with City staff and professionals to ensure they prepare any required maps, renderings or design plans and architectural/construction cost estimates.
- C. Prepare all narratives, resolutions, public notices, as required by the program guidelines and coordinate City activities as related to same.
- D. Submit the required documents and attachments to HUD on or before the submittal deadline.

The total compensation of the services covered by the Agreement will not exceed \$8,000.

II. THE CITY'S RESPONSIBILITIES

The City of Burlington will provide and be responsible for the following, as necessary to assure the effective completion of the ERR:

- A. With advice and assistance from CGP&H, prepare and execute any required resolutions.
- B. With advice and assistance from CGP&H, publish any required notices and file applicable certifications.



- C. Engage appropriate professionals to prepare any required maps, renderings or design plans and architectural/construction estimates.
- D. Coordinate the application and review process with the local Historic Preservation Commission (HPC).
- E. Perform other duties as required to comply with the program regulations.

III. COMPENSATION

Payment of said fees shall be due upon the regular submission of vouchers. Such vouchers shall include the amount of time spent and services performed. Payment in full for invoices submitted is required within forty-five (45) days of billing date. The total compensation for professional services covered by the Agreement shall not exceed \$8,000 in professional fees.

Any services of CGP&H not specified in this contract or performed within the ordinary course of its scope shall be covered by a subsequent contractual Agreement. Items which may require a subsequent contractual agreement include grant administration.

IV. TIME

THE CITY OF BURLINGTON

The Agreement shall be in effect from the date of this agreement and shall continue for 90 days or until the maximum compensation under this Agreement is reached or unless the Agreement is otherwise amended.

It is understood and agreed that each of the parties to this Agreement shall have the option to terminate said Agreement at any time after thirty (30) days notice is given by either party to the other.
